

Dunk Tank Rules

1. Please read the label attached to side of Dunk Tank before using.
2. Customers must provide a water source.
3. Customers must provide a water hose and attach hose to water source.
4. Dunk Tank will hold 510 gallons of water and will take approximately 1 hour to fill with proper water pressure. Dunk Tank weighs approximately 4000 pounds when full and needs approximately 10 feet in height to be set.
5. Dunk Tank should be filled to approximately 2 inches from top of the tank.
6. Dunk Tank will lose water throughout the event, please monitor for refills.
7. Although our steps have safety non-slip tape, please take every precaution when climbing steps.
8. Ten softballs will be furnished with each rental and should be the only ball used.
9. Do not allow anyone at anytime to push the target trigger by hand. Ground will be wet. This practice can lead to bodily harm.
10. Dunk Tank must be emptied **immediately** after the event. Children may want to play when unattended and drowning could occur.
11. Dunk Tank must be attended at **ALL** times.

Note: If you are putting a Dunk Tank in a City or State Park you must clear it with Park Manager. A water fee may be required.

Fire Departments sometimes will fill your Dunk Tank. The water from the fire truck may be rusty or muddy. This water may damage swim suits or cause illness.

Pitchers should stand back approximately 12 feet from target (small children 10 feet).
